

Teach Bhride Volunteer Application Due January 26, 2012

Thank you for considering Teach Bhride for your post-graduate service.

There are two steps to applying for *Teach Bhride:* the pre-application, and the application itself. For the pre-application, you need only to send an e-mail to <u>houseofbrigid@gmail.com</u> notifying the selection committee of your intention to apply. Please send this e-mail by January 1, 2012. This will assist us in allowing sufficient travel time for interviews.

The second step, the Teach Bhride application, consists of the following parts:

- Application form (including personal statement and essay)
- Résumé
- Two letters of recommendation
- Official college transcript (deliver to House of Brigid, Inc. headquarters)

All application materials must be postmarked on or before January 26, 2012. If this deadline presents a problem for you, please contact the House of Brigid at <u>houseofbrigid@gmail.com</u>.

The two recommenders who submit letters on your behalf will each need a recommendation form, which are included in the application packet. Notice that the forms are different, specified for "Personal Recommender" and "Professor Recommender." Be sure to fill out your portion of these recommendation forms before giving them to your recommenders with a stamped envelope addressed to:



- C. Developing and enriching a life of prayer and worship
- D. Understanding and promoting the teaching of the Church
- E. Witnessing through one's own faith commitment (e.g., implementing Catholic social teaching in one's one life)
- F. Working with others in mutually supportive and mutually educational relationships
- G. Working compatibly alongside other ministries and/or interacting with parish clergy and administrators
- H. Prioritizing and implementing diverse tasks
- I. Serving as a resource person for oral/written communications regarding parochial ministry

Please compose a personal statement of no more than 250 words describing:


- your motivations behind applying for *Teach Bhride*,

Please compose a brief essay of no more than 500 words either on a topic of your choice or specifically on an experience you have had as a leader or minister.


Section E: Recommendations


